Highlights Evidence in Financial Inclusion: New Findings and their Applications Policy Workshop

The Centre for Advanced Financial Research and Learning organised a Policy Workshop on 'Evidence in Financial Inclusion in collaboration with IFMR LEAD and Innovations for Poverty Action (IPA). The workshop was held in Mumbai on 20th July, 2016.

The objective of the policy workshop was to share evidence from recent research in digitizing financial products and services with key stakeholders and facilitate a focused discussion on the applications of this evidence to various contexts in India. The workshop also sought to identify knowledge gaps in promoting financial inclusion, and explore potential areas of collaboration between research, policy and practice between research, policy, and practice.

Session Themes included Experimentation for Innovation in promoting Financial Inclusion, Using Mobile Phones to influence Consumer Behaviour and Digitizing Savings and Payments.

The program was attended by senior delegates from select banks, technology service providers and other key stakeholders who are interested in using evidence from research and testing to improve product design and delivery.

After the opening remarks by G Gopalakrishna, Director, CAFRAL, U S Paliwal, Executive Director, Reserve Bank of India delivered the keynote address. This was followed by a special address by Professor Shawn Cole, Harvard Business School.

Program on Best Practices in Operational Risk Management was organized on July 28-29, 2016 in Mumbai. It was an interactive program with five groups brainstorming with mentors and expert session speakers resulting in participants experiencing deeper understanding and carrying actionable takeaways. The program was structured around five themes of ORM, namely, Business Continuity Management, Process Excellence, Cybercrime prevention & detection controls, Loan fraud management and Documentary & Mobile channel fraud management. Each theme was assigned to interested participants who worked for Group Presentations on Best practices.
